In Version 2.0, the Census Bureau added consolidated, organized, and publicly available links to key federal and non-federal datasets that can be used by both government and non-government entities interested in conducting broad analyses of COVID-19 pandemic impacts. Links to datasets are organized by category and by source.

Additional Federal Agency and Other Datasets

These additional datasets are provided to access relevant COVID-19 recovery data and analysis from public, non-profit, and private sector sources in partnership with FEMA and Argonne National Laboratory. For convenience, they are grouped into the categories of Business and Economics, Individuals and Households, and Government Services. These datasets are only a subset of the many Federal and private sector COVID-19 data available.
