## Results of the Pandemic


- Greater uncertainty

#### The Big Picture

Employers in North Carolina continued to add jobs in February. The pace of hiring has slowed as the number of job openings has fallen to near pre-pandemic levels, but with an unemployment rate well below 4% and few signs of mass layoffs, most employers appear eager to hold onto the workers they have. Residential building activity has rebounded despite high mortgage rates, a sign of robust demand for housing in our state.




