## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Alabama used the Statewide Planning Grant to conduct technical assistance in 10 counties across the state to advance broadband plan development. Meetings were held in each county to engage local leaders and those providing broadband services, discussing the state's vision and barriers towards broadband implementation. The remaining 57 counties were covered through Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment (BEAD) funding. A profile for each county was developed, featuring important broadband data, an interactive dashboard and a comprehensive final report with recommendations for expanding broadband access in the state.

The grantee indicated that this funding assisted in conducting countyspecific technical assistance and prepared each county during on-site meetings to take advantage of broadband-related funding opportunities.

The Digital Expansion Office within ADECA does not have a history of collaborating with EDDs. However, the EDDs were invited to partner, although most did not participate. ADECA stated that in the future, the office intends to collaborate more extensively with EDDs once there is a better understanding of how to involve them in broadband-related projects.

## **PROJECT DESCRIPTION**

Alaska's project aims to develop a new Statewide CEDS, create and staff a new broadband office to evaluate Alaska's eligibility for federal programs, and to assess and improve the mariculture regulatory environment. The grant will enable Alaska's new Broadband Office to review compliance requirements for the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) through a broadband task force. Additionally, Alaska will gather stakeholders in the mariculture industry to understand regulatory barriers affecting turnaround times and to produce a report that will be considered for legislation.

## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (EDD) ALIGNMENT

EDDs contributed to the development of Alaska's new statewide CEDS. Other aspects of the project were managed by industry and local organizations. DCCED maintained regular communication with EDDs during the plan's development, informing them about the subawards to support their efforts. EDDs were instrumental in advising the DCCED on the Statewide CEDS Strategy Committee and utilized their subawards for regional outreach, planning, and hosting community forums. After drafting the CEDS, EDDs assisted DCCED in refining the strategies, focusing on local community needs.

DCCED recognized the significant role of EDDs in this project and acknowledged their essential assistance in achieving the project objectives.

Arizona's project is dedicated to creating preliminary construction and engineering plans for workforce training accelerators, focusing on equipping workers for advanced manufacturing sectors, including electric vehicle production. The grant will support planning for the architecture, ventilation, power sources, and training concepts for these workforce centers. Initially designed as a state-wide initiative under the Build Back Better Regional Challenge (BBBRC), the focus has shifted to six training centers due to not securing BBBRC funds. The grantee has indicated that this funding is instrumental in mitigating overall costs and addressing inflationary pressures that could jeopardize the project.

Georgia's overarching goal focused on conducting a comprehensive study of the workforce across the state, encompassing five main activities: a statewide workforce assessment to gauge overall employment health, regional assessments to understand local labor markets, site-specific evaluations for targeted insights, planning sessions with state talent partners to strategize workforce development, and analyses of underemployed and unemployed residents to identify gaps and opportunities. Key to this endeavor was a focused collaboration with education partners, aiming to strengthen the workforce by aligning educational outputs with labor market needs.

Oklahoma's project focused on identifying business site location assets in 32 communities and the overall value proposition of the state as a location for the automotive industry. The findings will allow these communities to understand which industries are best suited to expand and locate in their geography. Three site location consultants evaluated site capabilities, identified gaps and limitations, and evaluated competitiveness to make industry and investment recommendations. The grant aims to help communities ensure potential sites are equipped with major infrastructure, such as gas and electric lines. The state expected communities to identify much larger sites but were surprised to find that smaller parcels were more common. Nonetheless, because of how successful the SPG project was, the program is now being replicated for 60 additional communities using state funds.

The state allocated a small portion of the funding to develop a training portal to raise awareness of the site location assets available throughout the state. The state hopes the site will see increased utilization in the coming months.
